Annabelle was born in Kansas City, MO and lived in the Kansas City metropolitan area her entire life. In high school she served as president of the student council. She was a member of St. Agnes Catholic Church for 50 years. She was a member of St. Cecilia Circle for 25 years and served as Treasurer. She was also active in leadership of Brownies and Girl Scouts. Following that she was a member of Good Shepherd Catholic Church for 19 years where she was a member of the Silver Liners Club. In her early years she worked for Missouri ex-Governor Guy Park and Carl Langknect, Attorneys. She retired from the Shawnee Mission Schools Food Service where she was an assistant cook and cashier for 30 years after staying home when her children were young. She loved working with the children. Following an injury in 2009 she moved into Villa St Joseph skilled nursing facility. Her leadership skills and friendly outgoing personality were quickly recognized and she soon found herself elected to the position of President of the Residents' Association. She enjoyed that leadership role for 6 or 7 years until she felt she could physically no longer perform the responsibilities of the position. Annabelle loved her church and had a great faith in her Saviour, Jesus Christ. She set a great example for her children and her legacy has been one of Christian faith. She was a prayer warrior and would get up at 3:30 AM every day to spend 2 hours praying for her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren and their spouses. She loved every member of her family and they loved her. She lived for the next family social event. Annabelle had a lighthearted up-beat positive approach to life and she lifted the spirits of everyone she came into contact with. She was even still able to get out a laugh in the hospital up to 3 days prior to her death. When she met the doctor taking care of her the last week of her life she told her, "Honey, you are too pretty to be a doctor." She was loved and will be greatly missed by all who knew her.
