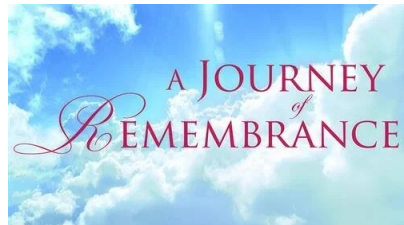

We've known your family since my folks lived across the street on Fisher when I was 1-6 1/2. Charles/Patty and Steve Vilmer lived next to us. We moved to back to McPherson in 1950 where I grew up and then in 1963 my family (Laurence, Jean, Lon, and Kathy) moved back to KC living in the Independence area until my dad's death in 1991. Charles came by and picked up your Mom to attend dad's funeral and we had a great time at the folks house after the funeral. That was the last time I personally saw your Mom but my mother contacted her over the years and followed her life.
