



Dorothy Elizabeth "Doe" Cook

July 6, 1930 - March 17, 2022

Dorothy E. "Doe" Cook, 91 yrs. old, of Kansas City, Kansas, passed away on March 17, 2022 in Independence, Missouri.

Graveside services will be held at Maple Hill Cemetery in Kansas City, Kansas at 11:30 AM Saturday March 26, 2022. Followed by a Celebration of Life at Maple Hill Funeral Home. Dorothy will be laid to rest with her late husband, Jack D. Cook.

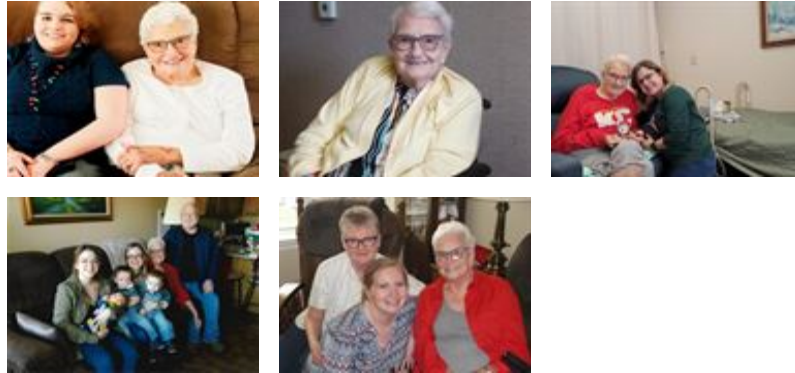
