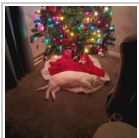
My condolences, I worked with Jerry at Garlock Chicago. He was always someone I could talk to while I was there. I'm glad I got to know him. May he rest in Paradise

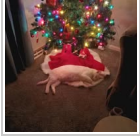
