Gordon E. Dawkins Sr., 88 of Fairway, Kansas passed away Wednesday, November 6, 2019, at The Heritage of Overland Park surrounded by his family.

He was born on April 11, 1931 in Friendship, TN the son of Reynolds and LaVerne Dawkins.

On April 14, 1949 he married the love of his life, Winifred "Winnie" Dawkins in Harrison, Arkansas. Ten years after their marriage they began their journey to California to start their own ministry. There they spent six years building the ministry until moving with one hundred members to the Kansas City area. He spent his free time reading the bible and studying theology to deepen his knowledge. He is now living his life motto and God's promise that "The Best is Yet to Come".
