James "Jim" Green II age 54 of Ravena, New York and formerly of Kansas City, Kansas passed away at his home in Ravena, New York, Friday, August 13, 2010. Jim was born in Kansas City, Missouri on April 3, 1956 the son of James N. Green I and Bennie Caudron (Dodson). He grew up in Kansas City, Kansas and graduated from Harmon High School in 1974. He proudly served in the United States Army from 1983-1993 with a Honorable Discharge as a motor transport operator and as a carpentry and masonry specialist. He earned the rank of Sergeant and served during the Persian Gulf War also known as "Operation Desert Storm". He earned the Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters, 2 Good Conduct Medals, National Defense Service Medal, NCO Professional Development Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, Driver and Mechanic Badge with the Army Lapel Button, Southwest Asia Service Medal with 3 Bronze Service Stars and Kuwait Liberation Medal. Jim began his construction career as a Boilermaker from Local 83 in Missouri and later as an Ironworker. He was also an inactive Mason of the Ben Hur Lodge 322 in Argentine, Kansas. He is survived by three daughters, Angela Green-Dahnke and her husband Jason and daughter Ella of Parker, Colorado, Kelly Stebbins and her husband Chris of Colorado Springs, Colorado, and Nicole Green and fiance Jeffery Singer of Overland Park, Kansas.
