



## Lawrence A. Camp

February 3, 1953 - November 30, 2014

Lawrence "Larry" A. Camp passed away at his home on Sunday, November 30th at the age of 61. Memorial services will be held at Maple Hill Funeral Home on Sunday, December 7th from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.
