“ My grandmother was one of the greatest people I have ever loved. I was too sad to speak at the funeral on behalf of memories of her, but I want to share a few of the moments I spent with her.

First off, I want to begin with this--my grandmother was in my life for 23 years. I spent many hours and days with her before she passed. She was the most beautiful, generous, kind, gentle, and loving person I have ever had the pleasure of loving.

She was always a part of my life and attended every major event. She was at every soccer game, every recorder concert in elementary school, and was my biggest fan in any process.

She used to take Hannah, Lauren, and I on "special days", where she would allow us to visit any stores and buy pretty much anything we wanted. She organized and led every holiday party--inviting the entire family to come, and she was the GPS for my grandpa. I hold every photo, email, video, and voicemail near and dear to my heart.

She beat cancer. Diagnosed in 2018, her lung cancer metastasized to her brain, making treatment very rigorous and taxing on her health. She wanted to watch my sisters and me grow up and become our biggest dreams. It was only a matter of time until the chemotherapy stopped working. This became very apparent when I saw her before she was bedridden.

August 4th was the final time we exchanged "I love you", after that, she was not able to speak or open her eyes. I was with her every single day until she passed. I held her hand, kissed her, and said my final goodbyes in the early hours of August 11th, 2021--where she was surrounded by love.

Grandma, thank you so much for everything. You were one of the most important people in my life. I think of you every single day and hope to be at least half the person you were. Thank you so much for everything. I love you forever and always...until we meet again.
