December 23, 1932 - February 9, 2017

Louis Menn, 84, died on February 10 in his home in Prairie Village, KS after a battle with cancer. We are thankful for his service and loyalty to God, his family and his country. He was a faithful elder of his church, Westwood Christian before it closed. Afterwards, he attended Olivet Baptist and met with members of Westwood Christian Church frequently. Born December 23, 1932 in Springfield, MO. He worked at ADI, Automotive Distributors Incorporated for over 25 years. It began in Wichita, KS. At age 16, Louis worked in one of their automobile stores and moved to Kansas City in 1976 to work in the credit department. He retired with Factory Motor Parts when he was 80. He loved working. Louis took a year off, then volunteered at Shawnee Mission Christian School, where his grandchildren attended and loved supervising lunch and recess. Always looking for something to fix, Louis was available to friends, relatives and neighbors to give mechanical help or advice. Although he would not speak of his time serving in the Korean War (except his dislike of rice), he enjoyed studying and discussing World War II. Survivors include his two sons, Phillip and Alan; daughter, Lisa Brown; four grandchildren; two great grandchildren and one sister, Mildred Riley. His wife Juanita of 51 years died in 2006. 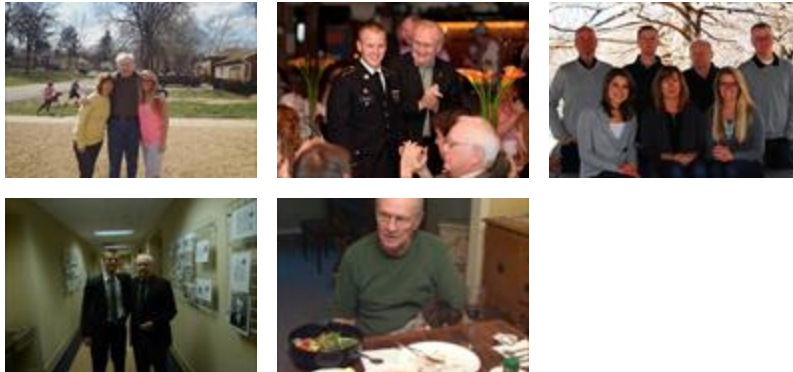
