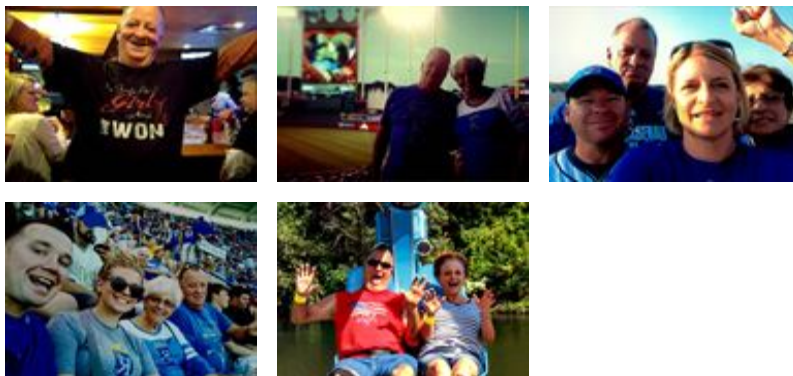

We gave each other lip service all the time, but we had an unspoken admiration and respect for each other.

Mike was a “larger than life” kind of guy. Never quiet. Never boring. He could make anyone laugh. He was generous. He was genuine.
