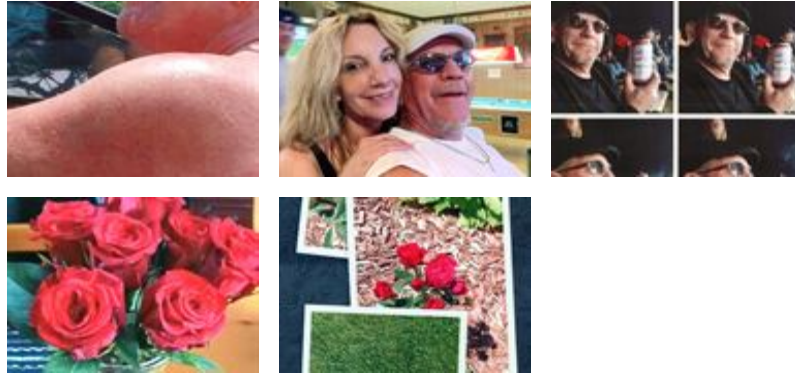

Mitch took me to Rick's Oar House and Marina at the Ozarks. We stayed in a cabin. Mitch slept the day away about 2pm in the afternoon he would wake up and we would eat and drink. That weekend Mitch made friends with lots of people at the marina I had a blast with him we danced the night away. That was just one good time. Mitch lost his son Nick Herd in 2013 it turned his world upside down. Mitch took me with him several times to visit Nicks gravesite he always took new flowers to put in his vase. I would help Peggy wash her hair and dry it sometimes she would fall asleep when I was drying it so I would just keep on drying it, Bob would always bring home lunch for us. Bob always had the best coffee every morning made when I got there. Bob always had Peggy her breakfast made before I got there. Sometimes I would bring bacon, they both liked that. Bob was a very devoted husband and father. I haven't met to many people like Bob and Peggy. They loved their Grandson Nick it tore a hole in their hearts when they lost him. They wore both vary devoted to Nick . They told me many stories about the times they had with their grandson. Nick had a love for Humming birds, he passed that on to

Peggy and Mitch. Peggy and i would watch the humming birds from her kitchen window. Mitch had a humming bird feeder on his front porch. I enjoyed watching them also. I really grew to love Mitch's parents. I will always love Mitch. I will carry them all in my heart forever. I thank God everyday for all the people he has put in my life.
