Oscar David Whitworth, 85, passed away November 5, 2010 at Providence Hospital in Kansas City, KS, surrounded by his loving family. He is survived by his wife of 30 years, Ella Whitworth, daughters Vicky Nash of Rantoul, KS, Shellie Cox and husband Larry of Belton, MO, Kathey Aza and husband Gene of Palm Springs, CA; sons Bill Custer and wife Sheila of Kansas City, KS; Steve Custer and wife Jacque of Grovespring, MO; David Whitworth of Lancaster, CA, and Mike Rodgers of Edwardsville, KS; 22 grandchildren, 35 great grandchildren, 6 great great grandchildren, and brother James Whitworth of Edwards, MO He was preceded in death by his parents, three sisters, one brother and two sons.

Dave was born in Kansas May 3, 1925 and lived in the Kansas City area most of his life, most recently Edwardsville, KS. He was a World War II veteran (proud to support his country and proud to be an American). He served in the US Navy Seabees April 12, 1943 - January 31, 1946, received a WWII Victory Medal and was a lifetime member of VFW Post 869. Dave also was a member of the Fraternal Order of the Eagles in Merriam, KS.

He worked as a truck driver for thirty years and retired from Leonard Brothers in 1980 and was a Teamster Local 41 retiree. After he retired, he worked for Tower Cleaners as a maintenance man for 3-4 years. Skills acquired in the Seabees served him well in his career as well as any type of construction work for home projects.

Dave loved boating, fishing and dancing. He especially loved spending time with his family, including his dog "Kinky". All agree he was a loving husband, caring father and the best friend you could have.

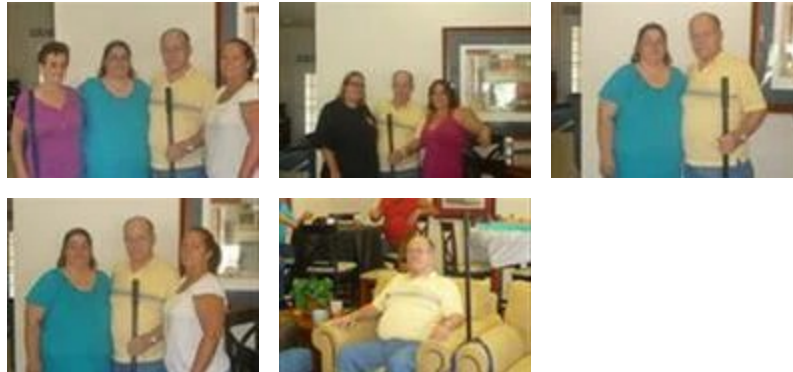
