“ I worked with Roy in the mid 70's. He had partnered up with Lee Roberts and they rented a small building on Troost. That was where Amco Products began. I knew Lee, and he brought me in to run the phone room. Lee was to manage the company, Roy was to run the sales end. They had worked together at Pacesetter, a window and awning outfit. The building was so small that Roy didn't have an office, and Lees office was so small that you had to lean your chair against the wall to visit. The phone room was in the back and if it rained hard it flooded.



With just the 3 of us I was also made the credit manager (which I knew nothing about), in charge of the salesmens commission, the janitor, opened up and made coffee mornings, and locked up at night when the phone room people left at 9pm. :-)

Roy told me he worked for the company that made Twinkies before getting into the sales business. He jokingly told me that Mrs. Chavez thought he was still working at the bakery when he told her he was a salesman at Pacesetter. He said his car looked so bad when he got into sales that he parked down the street from a customers house so they couldn't see it.

This may sound off the beaten path, but that is how I remember Roy, and he would write something similar about me. Roy had a huge heart beneath the happy go lucky person that people saw on the surface. He rolled with the punches and made light of serious

circumstances.
